














Ramping up for First in Human

- The Clinical Center's Office of Patient Recruitment (OPR) works with 19 ICs to increase participation in clinical trials offered at the hospital. In FY 2016, OPR received more than 40,000 phone inquiries and more than 5,000 email inquiries. This has resulted in thousands of well-screened referrals, as well as responses to general info requests about the hospital, NIH, and clinical trials generally.
- First In Human aired on three consecutive Thursdays: August 11th, 18th, and 25th. OPR was well-prepared for an immediate surge in interest.
 Examples of steps included:
 - Phone coverage hours were extended to 7 am 6 pm (normally 8 am 4 pm).
 - Staffing was increased from 4-6 agents to a minimum of 8-10 available at all times.
 - Line capacity was increased so if needed we could flex to as many as 25 agents taking calls.
 - In the unlikely event all of the agents got tied up on the lines, the size of our queue system was increased so that up to 25 additional callers can be on hold (up from the normal max of 13) awaiting an agent to pick up.
 - The extra staffing came from CC communications staff, CC volunteer office, medically reassigned nursing staff, Pathway program employee, and a recruitment specialist from another IC. All received extensive training.

* Total Calls include inbound and outbound





Night of 17/18 August 2017

- Patient with bone marrow failure (aplastic anemia) being conditioned for bone marrow transplant developed febrile neutropenia
- We had prepared for this eventuality
- We knew the patient was colonized with resistant organisms
- We had done the advanced planning to have the right antibiotics on hand
- Yet it took far too long to get antibiotics for Gram negative coverage into the patient
