Hello Everyone,

Wow... It is now my 25th year being a patient at the National Institute of Health (NIH). Thus, I would like to share with you all a little background on my journey to this facility.

From 1998 through 1999, I had several in-patient stays at the *Georgetown University Hospital*. In early 1999 while there, I met Dr. Laura O'Brien-Coster, who was doing her clinical rotation at that hospital. She took time out of her very busy schedule and told me about the *NIH*, plus tried to encourage me to enroll in a clinical trial.

Due to my severe anemia, I mentioned to her that I was very skeptical about enrolling because I had already been turned down numerous times by many drug companies, who were also conducting trials for my ailment. Meanwhile, I was continually getting physically weaker and weaker

However, on February 10, 1999 - due to Dr. O'Brien-Coster's assurances that I would not be turned away from being treated, I attended my first appointment at the *NIH*. That was one of the best decisions I've ever made!

Now, it is 25 years later and I'm still alive; I am still receiving cutting edge-lifesaving treatment at the *NIH*; plus, I am blessed to have had some of their best clinical teams on my case and as my friends. And, by the way, my first physician fellow was Dr. O'Brien-Coster.

There are many other great healing clinicians, staff and contractors at the NIH that the LORD has placed in my life over the years that I would like to also mention such as Nurse Pamela Stoll; Dr. Janaki Kurrupu; Dr. Tara Palmore; Dr. Alice Pau; Ms. Senora Mitchell et al. Although I cannot name everyone in this email, I do want to say "THANKS TO ALL OF YOU", who have been with me on this tremendous journey in my life at the NIH, during these past 25 years!



- In 2023: the NIH Sterile Processing Section significantly reduced the environmental impact of sterilization packaging for surgical devices in the operating room.
 - Tremendous amount of daily waste reduced by switching all containers encased in wrap to metal containers with result of using 1 case of wrap per day to 1/month!
 - Prevented occasional delays in surgery (a hole in the wrap, could result in the item having to be rewrapped and re-sterilized).
- Ultimately this project provided a reduction in waste, a reduction of the carbon footprint, a reduction in budget costs, and a reduction in the workload.



NIH Statue Unveiling and Dedication of "The Ladder"

- "The Ladder" blends biblical imagery and modern science, drawing parallels between Jacob's ladder and the structure of DNA.
- The bend in the path of the ladder is translated into the familiar double-helix of DNA.
- The 4 messengers "ascending and descending" become the 4 nucleic acids that encode genetic information. Mirroring these 4 messengers, or 4 nucleic acids, the 4 children climbing the ladder represent the diversity of humanity.




